



Percentage of Active Shooting Resolutions


















- What you do before an active shooter event will determine what you do during an active shooter event.
- 1. Communication system & plans
- 2. Classrooms; locks, window covers
- 3. Training
- 4. Mindset














2 hours from first shooting in dorm (2 killed)

10-12 minutes total time in Norris Hall

9MM pistols used, 28/30 where headshots

Shot Min of 3 times each

Avoid, Deny, Defend

Avoid

Be aware of your surroundings

- Gunfire has a distinct sound, repeated
- Reactions of other Know your exits, take the safest way out
- Use cover and concealment exiting
- Keep object between you and the attacker
- Use windows

Deny

- Lock doors, (do your classrooms have locks?)
- Turn off lights, lower window covers (sample)
- Silence cell phones
- Line up on wall out of sight of door/window
- Barricade door; use furniture, door stops
- Have a plan for children, they will be afraid
- Plan to get out of the room via windows
- Plan to defend yourself, look for fighting objects
- Position yourself by the door along the wall
- Wait for an official all clear

Defend

- Line up against wall closet to door, crouch, be small
- Use objects to attack, throw things
- Get behind the attacker
- Take the weapon away









- Time and distance advantage, just 2 seconds/7 feet
- Fight to the best of your ability
- Don't stop until the attacker is subdued
- Respond to police commands, empty hands raised

- 1. spray paints wall
- 2. waves gun and asked audience to leave
- 3. only resistance is little lady hits him with her purse

Denial - Get to Deliberation ASAP

Seconds count!

- Situational Awareness Warning signs (spray painting wall)
- Sounds like gun shots
- Announcement over intercom/phones

What Happens under Stress

- Physiological effects begin
- System 1 takes over, autonomic system; muscle memory, fight or flight, adrenaline, cortisol, lactic acid
- System 2 starts to shut down; thinking system
- You need both working together/Have a plan and practice it....

Deliberation - What are your options?

- Hide and hope is not a tactic VA Tech classrooms statistics
- Exits, Windows
- Barricade/Window Escape

Decisive Moment - Act decisively

Avoid, Deny, Defend









Lockdown Drills

- Communicate: phones, intercom, cell phones
- Update to everyone of shooter's position
- False fire alarm, multiple shooters
- Classroom doors lock from inside
- Door closers arms lock Barracuda magnets
- External doors lock quickly
- Cover door windows.
- Windows open to outside
