Imagine you lived in a place where very few people had ever heard of Jesus.

Nepal was that kind of place when Don Dent visited there 20 years ago. It's a small country between India and China, where Mount Everest — the world's tallest mountain — is located.

More than the mountains, though, Don saw the need for churches to be planted across Nepal. Don is not a missionary, but he helps train missionaries and pastors for their work as he teaches at Gateway Seminary of the Southern Baptist Convention in California. He directs the Kim School of Global Missions there.

Let me stop to say that Gateway is one of our six Southern Baptist seminaries in the United States that our church supports through our Cooperative Program giving. We're training more than 18,000 students in those schools, the biggest program of its kind in the country.
