“Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might.” — Ephesians 6:10

Everyone needs accountability. When the Titanic was built, it became known as the greatest ship ever and was said to be unsinkable. On that fateful night of April 15, 1912, the Titanic sank after striking an iceberg in the North Atlantic. She had been given nine warnings hours before she struck the iceberg. Every warning stated there were icebergs in the area and encouraged that the captain take caution.

1 Peter 5:8 states, “Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.” Peter warns believers that we have an enemy seeking to destroy us.
