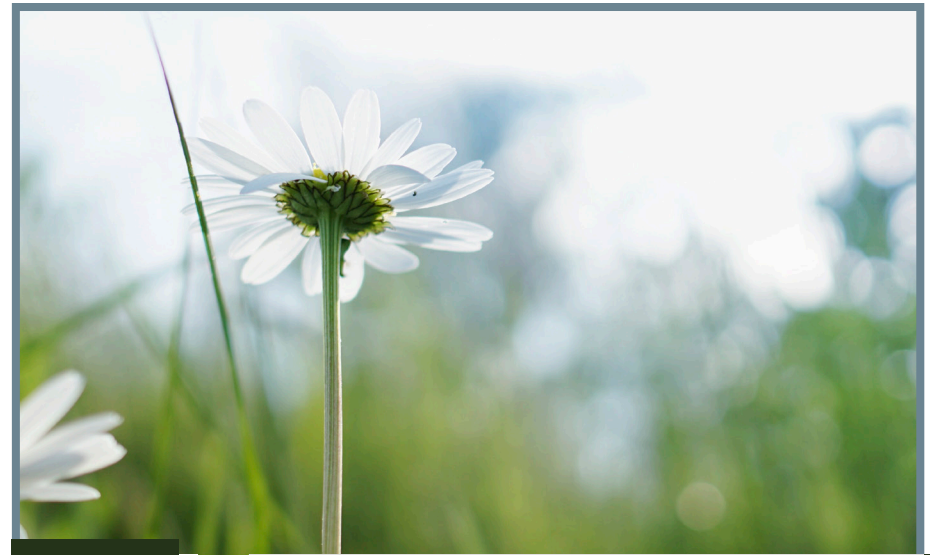
### Devotion
