In his well-known poem, Prayer, George Herbert masterfully demonstrates the power and beauty of prayer. Herbert was a Welsh-born poet, orator, and priest of the Church of England. In his short life of 38 years, he discovered the joy of a powerful and blessed life.

Herbert's poem, written in 1633, has reminded followers of Jesus Christ that prayer is a gift from God. The power that God gives to humanity with the gift of prayer is unfathomable. Herbert describes this power as an "engine against the Almighty" and "Reverse Thunder." Such imagery reminds us that there is no place we experience more power in our Christian lives than when we are on our knees before" God. The results of living a prayerful life are "peace, joy, love, and bliss." The final thought Herbert offers in his poem is that prayer is the blood of the soul. We experience abundant life from God as we press into Him with our prayers. Why is that? Perhaps, it is because prayer circulates the blood of Jesus in our souls more than any other activity. So, if you are feeling lethargic in your relationship with God, then perhaps you need to consider the health of your prayer life.
